Before the dance:

 Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, 408-871-9525 of any needed changes to assigned dates.

Purchase and bring 6 to 8 lbs ice for the water cooler.

- On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by 6:30 PM and stay until clean up is finished around 9:45 PM. A Katydids member with a key will open the doors and will secure the hall at end of evening.
- Sweep floor if needed and set up tables and chairs.
- · Make ice water and start hot water for tea & coffee.
- Set up food & drink tables and put out flyers on table.

During Club dance:

Welcome everyone at the sign-in table.

- Collect a \$5.00 donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for \$1.00.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds 50% to the Club, 50% to the winner.
- Check that water and cups do not run out during the evening.

After the dance:

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.
- ALL MEMBERS can help the Square Heads clean up. Help put away tables and chairs and pack up the coffee pot, cooler and other supplies put back into the Club cupboard.
- Remove non-recyclable trash accidentally tossed into the designated recycle bins. Take the trash bags out to the dumpster located in the side parking lot.
- · Sweep or wet mop the floor as necessary.
- Note: Tables must go into the closet FIRST (remember the Caller's table, too), then the chair rack.

TRAVEL TO PORTUGAL & SPAIN WITH CHAR PITTS

On her recent trip to Portugal and Spain, Char had the best ice cream she has ever tasted in her life in a small ice cream shop in Lisbon called Sabitini's. Italian style gelato yum! And the young men serving the ice cream were yummy to look at! Eye candy, or would you say eve gelato! The 16 day trip was organized through Overseas Adventure Travel and was an excellent trip with 15 travelers through the back roads of Iberia. They helped bake bread in a windmill in Portugal, harvested olives in southern Spain and then had a guided tour of the olive oil factory which included an olive oil tasting. They spent a long afternoon at a bull breeding ranch owned by a rather famous matador who joined them for lunch. They found out that the bulls are never allowed to associate with humans so that their first experience with a man on foot is when they enter the arena. Instead the bulls are tended by men on horseback.

One of the focuses of the trip was a people to people experience. So they chatted with a nun in a convent and tasted the yummy cakes the sisters made to earn

money, they had dinner in a private home--small groups of 4-6 travelers per home, visited the private home of a 90 year old woman who invited the whole group into her home to view the Roman relics she and her husband had found, digging on their own property. They interviewed students in a Portuguese university, they chatted with vintners, watched women weave hand made rugs/carpets in a tiny town Portugal, and watched an enthralling demonstration of the Flamenco dance and the accompanying Spanish guitar. Experiencing the food and cuisine of the two countries was also high on the list and included tapas which are tasty snacks featuring olives, seafood, bread, cheese, special Iberian ham, and tomatoes. They drank a lot of wine, dipped their bread into olive oil, and enjoyed a true Spanish delicacy "chocolate and churros" for breakfast one morning. Great trip, but she was happy to sleep in her own bed, even though on the trip she had slept in a convent, a remodeled castle, a converted city hall, and an ancient hotel.



From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti - -

MARVELOUS DUMP CAKE

Preheat oven to 350°F

1 large can of fruit (cherries, blueberries, blackberries)

1 can crushed pineapple, drained

1 box white cake mix

1 stick margarine or butter

· Spread both cans of fruit in the bottom of a baking dish

· Sprinkle the dry cake mix on top.

Slice butter into thin pats and place on top of dry cake
 mix.

· Bake at 350°F until golden brown on top.

From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti - -

APPLE NUT COFFEE CAKE

Preheat oven to 350°F

Grease a 13 x 9-inch cake pan

Cake:

1-18.25 oz pkg white cake mix

3 eggs

1/2 c. water

1/3 c. vegetable oil

2 c. apples (3 large), peeled & grated (use medium coarse grater size, not fine size)

Topping:

1/2 c. brown sugar, packed

1/2 c. nuts, chopped

1 t. ground cinnamon

1 T. better, melted

 <u>Cake</u>: In a large mixer bowl, combine cake mix, eggs, water and oil. Beat on medium speed for 2 minutes.
 Stir in apples, mixing until thoroughly blended.
 Spread batter evenly in prepared pan.

• Topping: In a bowl, combine brown sugar, nuts, cinnamon and melted butter. Mix well. Sprinkle evenly over batter. Bake for 35 to 45 minutes or until a tester inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool 30 minutes in pan on wire rack. Serve warm or cool.

Variations:

· Can use pears instead of apples

Can add 1 T. grated orange zest to the batter.

From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti --

EGGNOG SPICE BUNDT CAKE

Preheat oven to 350°F

Coat a nonstick bundt pan with cooking spray.

1-18.25 ox box spice cake mix

1 box instant vanilla or cheesecake pudding & pie filling mix (4-serving size)

1 c. nonfat vanilla yogurt 1/4 c. vegetable oil

1 c. light eggnog

1 egg

3 egg whites

1 1/3 c. pecans, tasted & chopped

Powdered sugar

 Combine cake mix, pudding mix, yogurt, oil, eggnog, egg & egg whites in a large bowl. Mix until creamy.

· Stir in pecans.

· Pour into prepared pan.

 Bake 40 to 45 minutes, until a wooden pick inserted in the center comes out clean.

· Cool on a wire rack.

· When cool, dust with powdered sugar.

From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti --

UPSIDE DOWN SPICE CAKE

1/4 c. butter

3/4 c. brown sugar, packed

1/2 c. coconut, shredded

1 16-oz can peach slices, drained

1 pkg spice cake mix

 In a 13x9x2 inch baking pan, melt the butter. Stir in the brown sugar and coconut. Top with the peach slices.

. In a mixer follow directions for the cake mix.

 Spread batter evenly over the peach mixture in the pan.

 Bake according to cake mix directions until toothpick comes out clean. Cool cake 5 minutes on a wire rack; invert onto cake plate. Serve. warm.


