Before the dance:

• Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, (408-871-9525 of any needed changes to assigned dates.

• YOU DO NOT NEED TO BRING ICE!

 On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by 6:30 PM. and stay until clean up is finished around 9:45 PM. A Katydids member with a key will open the doors and will secure the hall at end of evening.

• Place "Caution" signs (located in the storage/supply room along with a map) in designated areas of the parking lot where there are tripping hazards.

 Make ice water using provided cubes in freezer and make coffee.

• Set up drinks and supplies on counter.

 Place leftover snacks, napkins and flyers on tables at back of the hall.

During Club dance:

- Set up the sign in table and welcome everyone as they enter.
- Collect a \$5.00 donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for \$1.00.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds with 50% to the Club, 50% to the winner. (Note: odd dollar goes to the winner!)
- Check that water and cups do not run out during the evening.
- After announcements and raffle, feel free to dance except for the last tip (unless you are needed to fill a square) when you will need to be putting things away and cleaning up

After the dance:

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.
- Pack up the sign-in items, leftover snacks and flyers.
 Empty and dry coffee pot and cooler and pack up other supplies and return them to the shelf in storage room.
 Wipe counter and tables where needed.
- Empty garbage can if more than half full. The dumpster is located in the side parking lot.
- Sweep up crumbs from the floor as needed.
- Notify the Quartermasters, Maxine or Lloyd (408-241-7567) of any replacement supplies needed for the next week.



An ER doctor finally inserted a tube in a vein located near the right collar bone. She was admitted and again is in her 3rd week at El Camino. A number of new tests were done but all proved to be negative. I told the doctor he would not hurt my feelings if he sought 2nd, 3rd and 4th opinions which he said he has been doing. Teaching at Stanford helps him access to many fellow doctors. So for the moment he is going to concentrate back to the original diagnosis of microscopic colitis of about I am now more aware of the a year ago. importance of and problems dehydration may cause. Be sure you remain hydrated with water and electrolytes especially during the hot weather coming up...

From the Kitchen of Pat Angotti - -

TRIPLE-CHOCOLATE CAKE, #2

Makes 2 coffee cakes Preheat oven to 350°F

- 1- 18.25 oz pkg devil's food cake mix
- 1-3.9oz pkg chocolate instant pudding mix
- 2 c. sour cream
- 1 c. butter, softened
- 5 large eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 3 c. semisweet chocolate chips, divided
- 1 c. white chocolate chips
- 1 c. pecans, toasted & chopped
- Beat first 6 ingredients at low speed with an electric mixer 30 seconds or just until moistened; beat at medium speed 2 minutes. Stir in 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips; pour batter evenly into 2 greased and floured 9-inch square cake pans.
- Bake at 350° for 25 to 30 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean.
 Let cool completely in pans on wire racks
- Microwave white chocolate chips in a glass bowl at HIGH 30 to 60 seconds or until chips melt., stirring at 30-second intervals until smooth. Drizzle evenly over cakes; repeat procedure with remaining 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips. Sprinkle pecans over cakes. Cut into squares or wedges.

TROPICAL DUMP CAKE

Preheat oven to 350°F

Grease a 13x9 pan

2-20oz cans crushed pineapple, undrained


1-18 1/4 oz pkg white cake mix

1/2 c. butter or margarine, cut up

2 c. pecans, toasted

ice cream or whipped topping

- Drain 1 can crushed pineapple and spread all of pineapple on bottom of a lightly greased 13x9 pan.
- Sprinkle cake mix over the frit
- Dot evenly with butter.
- Sprinkle with pecans.
- Bake for 45-50 minutes or until golden and bubbly.
- Serve with cice cream.





