Before the dance:

• Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, (408-871-9525) of any needed changes to assigned dates.

• YOU DO NOT NEED TO BRING ICE!

- On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by **6:15** PM.and stay until clean up is finished around 9:45 PM. A Katydids member with a key will open the doors and will secure the hall at end of evening.
- Check the restrooms for supplies & tidiness.
- Make ice water using provided cubes in freezer and make coffee.
- Sweep the floor as necessary & set up the sign-in table.
- Bring out additional **chairs** from storage room as needed.
- Set up drinks and supplies on counter.
- Place snacks, napkins and flyers on tables at back of the hall.

During Club dance:

- Welcome everyone as they enter.
- Collect a \$5.00 donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for \$1.00.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds with 50% to the Club, 50% to the winner. (Note: odd dollar goes to the winner!)
- Check that water & cups do not run out during the night.
- After announcements and raffle, feel free to dance except for the last tip (unless you are needed to fill a square) when you will need to be putting things away and cleaning up

After the dance:

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.
- Pack up the sign-in items, leftover snacks and flyers.
- Empty coffee pot and dry the cooler and pack up other supplies and return them to the shelf in storage room.
- Wipe counter and tables where needed.
- Empty garbage can if more than half full. The dumpster is located in the side parking lot.
- Sweep up crumbs from the floor as needed.
- Return extra chairs to the storage room
- Notify the Quartermasters, Maxine or Lloyd (408-241-7567) of any replacement supplies needed for the next week.

Char Pitts' Grand Adventure!

HI Katydids,

Have you ever been to New England and Cape Cod? This was a dream of mine, on my bucket list for a long time, and when I discovered a Collette Tour that covered a trip to Providence, Boston, Newport and the Cape, including Martha's Vineyard, Nantucket, Hyannis, and Provincetown, I jumped at the opportunity.


To recap briefly, the tour began in Providence, (home of Collette Tours, which has been in business for more than 100 years), on a very comfy 56 passenger bus for our 43 person group. Providence is a beautiful small city which hosts one of the most beautiful state capital buildings in all of the US. We heard about Roger Williams the patriot who insisted that in drafting the constitution for our new nation that there be a provision for a separation of church and state, we passed through the campus of Brown University one of the oldest of the Ivy League universities, and ate dinner at Zooma's on Federal Hill, an old Mafia hangout, which boasts at least 20 fine Italian restaurants. Next day onto Boston for a huge dose of American history, a visit to Old Ironsides which is in the process of a 5 year restoration program, lunch at the famous Quincy Market, and on to Newport where we visited, the Marble House of Vanderbilt fame, so elegant and luxurious that it puts Trump Towers to shame. The Vanderbilts used this for only 6 weeks of the year! Unreal!

The remainder of the tour was spent on Cape Cod where we stayed in a lovely beachside lodge called the Sea Crest Beach Hotel. Since our tour guide, Melanie, was born and raised in Falmouth, one of the larger cities on the Cape, we heard lots of local color stories. Our first day the weather was so horrid that the maritime officials closed the ports so no boats could sail—therefore, no whale watching trip for us! Instead we visited Provincetown-often called Ptown by the locals—where the pilgrims first touched land on this continent. And why there? Because the weather was so horrid they couldn't sail around the peninsula to Plymouth. 3 months later they sailed on to Plymouth and landed on Plymouth Rock, supposedly, and set up their first all weather encampment. We did visit Plymouth Rock very briefly because it was very cold and windy. P-town was quite interesting, with more historical facts and places; and we found out that that day set a record for the lowest high temperature for that date in 90 years. But the next two days were beautiful,

though still cool, and we got to ride the ferry over to Martha's Vineyard one day, and Nantucket Island the next. We finished off our trip with a fabulous lobster feed which was supposed to be held on the beach as the locals often do, but since it was colder and windier than usual, we were served our lobster inside the beachside restaurant where we watched a glorious sunset finish off our fabulous memories of a wonderful trip.



Collette Tours are available on every continent, so if you are wanting to go on a guided tour, check them out! There was a couple on the trip from Melbourne, Australia, visiting the East Coast for 6 weeks, who found out the it was less expensive and way more convenient and interesting to join our tour than to wing it on their own for the portion of their trip to New England and the Cape.

THEME: Donald Duck's Birthday



National Donald Duck Day

National Donald Duck Day, June 9

Donald Duck first appeared in the 1934 cartoon *The Wise Little Hen* which was part of the *Silly Symphonies* series of theatrical cartoon shorts. The film's release date of June 9 is officially recognized by the Walt Disney Company as Donald's birthday despite a couple of in-universe contradictions. Wikipedi Donald's appearance in the cartoon, as created by animator <u>Dick Lundy</u>, is similar to his modern look – the feather and beak colors are the same, as is the blue sailor shirt and hat – but his features are more elongated, his body plumper, and his feet smaller. Donald's personality is not developed either; in the short, he only fills the role of the unhelpful friend from the original story.

Burt Gillett brought Donald back in his Mickey Mouse cartoon, Orphan's Benefit, released August 11, 1934. Donald is one of a number of characters who are giving performances in a benefit for Mickey's Orphans. Donald's act is to recite the poems Mary had a little lamb and Little Boy Blue, but every time he tries, the mischievous orphans heckle him, leading the duck to fly into a squawking fit of anger. This explosive personality would remain with Donald for decades to come.

Donald continued to be a hit with audiences. The character began appearing regularly in most Mickey Mouse cartoons. Cartoons from this period, such as the 1935 cartoon *The Band Concert* – in which Donald repeatedly disrupts the Mickey Mouse Orchestra's rendition of *The William Tell Overture* by playing *Turkey in the Straw* – are regularly hailed by critics as exemplary films and classics of animation. Animator Ben Sharpsteen also minted the classic *Mickey, Donald, and Goofy* comedy in 1935, with the cartoon *Mickey's Service Station*.

In 1936, Donald was redesigned to be a bit fuller, rounder, and cuter, the first to feature this design was the cartoon <u>Moving Day</u>. He also began starring in solo cartoons, the first of which was January 9, 1937, Ben Sharpsteen cartoon, <u>Don Donald</u>. This short also introduced a love interest of Donald's, <u>Donna Duck</u>, who evolved into <u>Daisy Duck</u>. He Donald's nephews, <u>Huey</u>, <u>Dewey and Louie</u>, would make their first animated appearance a year later in the April 15, 1938, film, <u>Donald's Nephews</u>, directed by <u>Jack King</u> (they had been earlier introduced in the Donald Duck <u>comic strip</u> by <u>Al Taliaferro</u>, see below). By 1938, most polls showed that Donald was more popular than Mickey Mouse. Disney could, however, help Mickey regain popularity by redesigning him, giving him his most appealing design as production for the <u>Fantasia</u> segment "The Sorcerer's Apprentice" began in 1938.

After his early appearances, he went on to become part of the famed trio Mickey, Donald, and Goofy. He appeared in many of the cartoons, including *Moving Day*.





