MINUTES

Katydids Executive Board Meeting February 24, 2006

President Lloyd Darknell called the meeting to order at 9:36 PM.

Roll call: Officers present were President, Lloyd Darknell; VP. Bob Bennett; Secretary, Bill Benevento; Publicity, Don Gaubatz. Officers absent were Treasurer, Bob Hebson; Membership, Morris Hosoda and Chaplain, Marilyn Shaver.

<u>Visitors</u> present were Chirper Editor, Stephanie Stevens, Sheriff, Don Powell and Anne Bennett.

The Minutes of the January 6, 2006 Meeting were approved.

Reports:

- 1. The President reported that the preliminary results from the Sweetheart Special were positive and that approximately 25 squares attended.
- 2. The Vice- President had nothing to report other than to express his thanks to all the Katydids who worked so hard to make the SHS the success.
- 3. The Treasurer was not present and no report was presented.
- 4. Membership reported that there were currently 49 active and 11 inactive members in the Club. Inactive members Jake and Elsie Ignacio are back to active membership. (With the additions of both Maxine Cintas and Caroline Fifield, one of whom is already included in the 49 noted above, our active count is now 50).
- 5. The Chaplain was not present and no report was presented.
- 6. The Publicity Chair had nothing to report.

Committees:

The Chirper editor reported that the Chirper deadline for submission of articles would be 2/24.

Old Business:

- 1. Lloyd Darknell reported that due to other Club priorities he had made no progress on the new Club banner.
- 2. Lloyd further reported that Pat Angotti had made good progress in obtaining members to fill the 2006-07 Slate of Officers for the upcoming election at the General Meeting to be held on April 7.

New Business:

- 1. <u>Picnic</u>: Louise Stagnitto during the first week of March would seek to reserve space for the Club picnic to be held 6/25 (ed. note: date changed to 6/11) this year
- 2. The Board voted into membership both Maxine Cintas and Caroline Fifield.
- 3. Don Powell, Sheriff reported that during the Class instruction tips, the noise level emanating from those on the sidelines had risen to the point of interfering with the dancers on the floor being able to hear and carry out the calls. Although the Club encourages socialization, the Board agreed that we must also be respectful to the needs of all dancers and especially the Katydoers who are being called upon to process many new and unfamiliar calls during their instruction. An announcement to this end would be made from the stage during the next dance.
- 4. A discussion was held regarding the "Fifth Friday Dances". Approximately, once a quarter there is a fifth Friday during a given month and our Club has been approached by other Clubs who have indicated a desire of having a combined dance on such night at a rotating venue. Since we have a Class in progress, it was decided to table any decision on the matter until much later in the year but to proceed and obtain more information as to the logistics should we eventually decide to go forward with the proposal.

The next Board meeting will be held Friday, March 24th following the Club dance that night.

HELLAU! This is the call all over because it is FASCHING (carnival) People love to disguise themselves at this time of the year. Willi and I went to two parties. WOW...dancing and fun! Everybody was in a good mood. You see many funny costumes. And when people are in a costume, they forget all their problems and they are free from cares...you see clowns (like me), cowboys (like Willi), animals and... and ... and all are smiling and celebrating FASCHING. So today we are pretty tired because we came home very late. It is not like we are 18 any more...well, only a few days older...<smile>



The countdown is running. We are so excited and can't wait and you know why? Some of our best friends are coming for a visit. It makes me feel great to think of the good time we will have! Yeahhhhhh. Char and Don! We are waiting and I'm so sure when you are here, the weather will show the best side, too.

Feb. 3

Willi and I visited a ballet. It was absolutely great!!!! Stuttgart residents are quite rightly very proud of their Ballet Company which enjoys a worldwide reputation.

Once a month we love to do something in arts...if it is possible for Willi.

Feb. 4

We had company: our nephew, daughters and niece visited us. Willi and I think that particularly at this time in the world it is so important that the family be closer together. So we called and invited them for the weekend. From all over they came and I have to tell you this was so much fun.

Feb 5

We showed the family members part's of Stuttgart. Our home is in the BOHNENVIERTEL (Bean Quarter) district. City history of an entirely different kind was written in the BOHNENVIERTEL. Built in the 15th century as the first residential district outside the city walls, it became home to craftsmen; in particular tanners, dyers, butchers and winegrowers. The name is a reminder of the beans, lentils and peas which the thrifty winegrowers once planted in the gardens. After major urban redevelopment measures in the 1980s, the BOHNENVIERTEL is now regarded

throughout Germany as a model of typical district planning. A district in which age-old artisan houses and new city homes mingle people, a place where people enjoy living and, even more like to visit. Many of the wine taverns are reminiscent of the "Besenwirtschaft" of winegrowers in bygone times and they become extremely cozy when you sit close together over a glass of wine.

Feb. 16

The sun is shining and the day's are longer. In the morning when we get up it is not dark anymore. Not long ago Willi left the house in darkness and when he came home it was dark, too. It looks like spring is coming!

22 Feb.

Now I know why the Germans stoop down all around...It is because it is so cold outside most of the time during the winter season.

Yesterday it was warm and sunny, today brrrrrrr so cold! I think springtime is far away and we get snow again.

Today was my first day as a volunteer at the Robert Bosch Hospital I am with a few women from the American - German Woman's Club. We serve cake, coffee, and tea and we talk to and with the seniors. These people are so thankful for the interest and I'm thankful, too. The ladies I talk with are between 75 and 95, I am interested in their stories. After three hours with many of the patients having smiling faces ...mine, of course, too. The Women's Club is a very active social group. Next week we will give food to the homeless people in the Church and of course try to help.

Saturday 25 Feb 2006

Today we had so much fun at the RITTER SPORT Chocolate Factory. It was soooo interesting! Willi and I took a behind the scenes look at the world of chocolate in the varied and interactive chocolate exhibition. We learned about the origin of cocoa and chocolate: The first people who prepared a drink from the roasted seeds of the cacao tree were the Olmecs. They lived over 3,500 years ago in Central America. From them, the Mayas and Aztecs took over the culture of chocolate. Both people considered the cacao tree as being sacred. When Christopher Columbus reached the Island of Guanja (Honduras) in 1502, the Indians living there offered him cocoa beans as a hospitality gift. However, he was unable to enjoy drinking the bitter chocolate...the addition of sugar came later. Can you believe this????

In the Chocolate Factory, each month they use some 250 tons of whole hazelnuts in Walderbuch (this is the place we visited today), and the chocolate weighs about as much as 111 elephants. I feel like one of them, because we ate so much "yummy" chocolate!






