Before the dance:

- Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, 408-871-9525 of any needed changes to assigned dates.
- Purchase and bring 6 to 8 lbs ice for the water cooler.
- On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by **6:30** PM. and stay until clean up is finished around 9:45 PM. A Katydids member with a key will open the doors and will secure the hall at end of evening.
- Sweep floor if needed and set up tables and chairs.
- Make ice water and start hot water for tea & coffee.
- Set up food & drink tables and put out flyers on table.

During Club dance:

- Welcome everyone at the sign-in table.
- Collect a \$5.00 donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for \$1.00.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds 50% to the Club, 50% to the winner.
- Check that water and cups do not run out during the evening.

After the dance:

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.
- ALL MEMBERS can help the Square Heads clean up. Help put away tables and chairs and pack up the coffee pot, cooler and other supplies put back into the Club cupboard.
- Remove non-recyclable trash accidentally tossed into the designated recycle bins. Take the trash bags out to the dumpster located in the side parking lot.
- Sweep or wet mop the floor as necessary.
- Note: Tables must go into the closet FIRST (remember the Caller's table, too), then the chair rack.
- Notify the Quartermasters, **Steven Lehnhoff or Naomi Grubb** (408-227-3631) of any replacement supplies needed for the next week.

UPDATE: KEITH & MEG FERGUSON

Copied below are a couple of email messages forwarded by Jim Osborne on 24 October and 3 November 2015 regarding Keith & Meg Ferguson. Keith and Meg are both very much in our collective hearts and prayers.

From a message dated 10/23/15 "Update on Keith" by Ann Mayers, forwarded to Jim Osborne and others on 10/24:

Hi everyone,

Tim visited Keith this morning and was present during the extubation. I visited this afternoon. His voice is lower than usual and a bit rough, but he's speaking well. He said he's fine with information about him being shared with everyone.

Keith experienced some chills on Wednesday that were similar to what occurred three other times during the past year, resolving spontaneously each time and for which subsequent lab tests and examinations did not reveal the cause. This time, he decided to go to Urgent Care at the time of the problem, reasoning that he should be more proactive because of Meg's situation.

He talked to his neighbor, a retired ER physician, who offered to drive him and then recommended that they go to Emergency at El Camino Hospital Los Gatos. At the hospital, the possibility of surgery was discussed and Keith signed the forms. Suddenly, he took a turn for the worse and was intubated and sedated.

The next thing he knew, he woke up in a hospital room and asked when the surgery would be done. He had been transported by ambulance to El Camino Hospital Mountain View on Wednesday night. Open heart surgery had been performed on Thursday—triple bypass. The surgeon arrived during my visit and told him that one area of his heart had been compromised, but a bit of squeezing helped restore circulation to the area, so he has minimal lasting damage and his heart is in great condition!

The first thing I saw when I arrived at Keith's room was a large, bright red pillow in the shape of a valentine heart that has a drawing of an anatomical heart on one side. When he coughs, he pulls it to his chest, pressing it to inhibit chest expansion, i.e., so he won't "pop any stitches."

He is receiving pain meds but is not sedated, so he is lucid and is his usual conversational self.

For now, he is in Critical Care but will be moved within the next few days. He requested that visitors wait until he has been moved to a more visitor-appropriate location, so I'll keep you informed. I forgot to ask about phone calls.

Keith's nurse said that between El Camino and Almaden Health and Rehab Center (2065 Los Gatos Almaden Rd., San Jose), they could arrange for some phone calls Actually, Keith's brother-in-law has his cell phone and will be locating the charger. I'm thinking that my cell phone and I could be with Meg, so she would have a speaker phone for the call. If Keith's phone has FaceTime, they could even see each other!

Knowing that Keith would want to know how he was tracked down, I typed up a chronology of what I did. Nancy Scharfen called me on Thursday night to tell me that Keith was at El Camino (which I already knew, but she didn't know that)—she knew because her father, Bill Scharfen, is a volunteer there! If you have stories, too, let me know and I will make a compilation. I have attached my chronology, in case anyone is interested.

BTW, I'm providing Meg with hard copies of everything I send out.

Attached to the above email was a note from Ann Mayers to Keith dated 10/23/15 listing the various things that happened that day in chronological order. It is not reproduced here.

Then on 11/1/15, Aahz sent Jim (and probably others) a message updating the situation. Jim forwarded it to me, 11/3/15:

Subject: Meg/Keith update Thurs 10/29 [please forward to everyone who might want to know]

Howdy

I dropped by to see Meg today, I wasn't planning on seeing Keith. I figured he'd be too busy from moving to the rehab place, plus I thought people would be more focused on visiting Keith and Meg could use some visitors.

However, I ran into Keith right after getting there -- he was moving into Meg's room! Keith is pretty busy with rehab, so if you visit, you should probably plan on spending more time with Meg, anyway.

Keith looked pretty good, seemed to be about 99% in brainpower and personality. (He was hovering over his old room to make sure they moved everything The Right Way.)

Meg unfortunately still has a long way to go, but she looks better than last time. Almaden Rehab is an incredibly noisy facility, and Meg now talks louder, making it much easier for me to hear her.
