Before the dance:

• Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, (408-871-9525 of any needed changes to assigned dates.

• YOU DO NOT NEED TO BRING ICE!

 On scheduled night, the designated Square Heads should arrive by 6:15 PM.and stay until clean up is finished around 9:45 PM. A Katydids member with a key will open the doors and will secure the hall at end of evening.

• Place "Caution" signs (located in the storage/supply room along with a map) in designated areas of the parking lot where there are tripping hazards.

 Make ice water using provided cubes in freezer and make coffee.

• Set up drinks and supplies on counter.

 Place leftover snacks, napkins and flyers on tables at back of the hall.

During Club dance:

- Set up the sign in table and welcome everyone as they enter.
- Collect a \$5.00 donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests sign the prepared sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with petty cash for making change.
- Offer raffle tickets: 5 tickets for \$1.00.
- In the green box, there are envelopes for keeping track of money collected during the evening.
- Divide the raffle proceeds with 50% to the Club, 50% to the winner. (Note: odd dollar goes to the winner!)
- Check that water and cups do not run out during the evening.
- After announcements and raffle, feel free to dance except for the last tip (unless you are needed to fill a square) when you will need to be putting things away and cleaning up

After the dance:

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.
- Pack up the sign-in items, leftover snacks and flyers.
 Empty and dry coffee pot and cooler and pack up other supplies and return them to the shelf in storage room.
 Wipe counter and tables where needed.
- Empty garbage can if more than half full. The dumpster is located in the side parking lot.
- Sweep up crumbs from the floor as needed.
- Notify the Quartermasters, Maxine or Lloyd (408-241-7567) of any replacement supplies needed for the next week.

From Skip & Steph:

To our Katydids friends --

Morris asked us to write up something about our current cross-country van-camping road trip. Below are some notes from our journal about our travels. We packed up the van, corralled Jackie, our 2 year old Jack Russell Terrier and took off Tuesday, August 30^{th.} While we had already decided to head north first, it wasn't until we were actually on the road that we decided just which route to take! The North Coast of California (vs. I-5) won and off we went. All the previous week the coast of California had been blanketed in fog and we didn't think that we wanted to drive miles and miles and see everything in gray. Well, we lucked out! Tuesday, and Wednesday turned out to be nofog days. Beautiful ocean vistas and sunlight dappled redwood forests. Lovely!

The first night we stayed at Salt Point State Park. This is where we discovered the first (of not too many, I hope!) trip disasters. Well, near disaster . . . our 3-gallon bottle of water somehow tipped over and leaked half its contents onto our bedding in the back of the van while on the road. In the waning daylight we scrambled to figure out just what to do. Thankfully we had put a large blue plastic tarp under our sleeping area "just in case." We placed it on the ground at the campsite to spread out a soaked sheet, light blanket, and towels. Skip's very wet sleeping bag was hung from an accommodating tree and a bush allowed us to cover it with our wet electric mattress pad cover. Things were still wet in the morning (Wednesday, 9/1), of course, so we went in search of a laundromat up the road a bit. We spent the morning in Anchor Bay trying to get things dry(er). We loaded everything back into the van and were on our way with some items spread out in the back of the van to continue to dry. We continued on up to Hwy 101 to the Redwoods where we stayed that night. And, thankfully our particular site had a deck handrail that we could hang our still wet thick moving pad and electric mattress pad cover.

Oops! Another issue! My clothes bin had toppled over at some point and many of my clothes ended up getting pretty wet from the electric mattress pad which for some reason did not seem to get very dry at the laundromat. Now another scramble to get these clothes hung up somewhere to dry. I had thought to pack some clothes pins that hang on a clothes bar. I hung up several of my shirts and the pants I slung over the bar. They were kind of in our faces as we slept but by morning most items were dry. Yeah!

We spent several days in Portland visiting with several friends.. As we were ready to leave, we checked the weather reports and discovered that the Canadian Rockies that we wanted to see next would be in rain, rain, snow, snow. Scrubbed that part of the plan. Figured we wouldn't see anything anyway.

Monday, Sept. 5, we loaded up the van at a leisurely pace and headed east on I-84 along the south side of the Columbia River. In the morning we wanted to see the National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center. I had seen it years ago and Skip had not so this was a "must see" stop for us. Most impressive was seeing actual wagon tracks in the grassy landscape still there after 150 years. One of my gr-gr-grandmothers came to Oregon in 1852 on that trail.

Wednesday, the morning of the 7th, after some deliberation as to whether to go up into the Sawtooth Mountain range, we decided to head for the Craters of the Moon National Park which Skip had never seen. The deciding fact was an enormous fire in the Sawtooth Mountain Range which could negatively impact both the route we took and general visibility.

Craters of the Moon really and truly looked other worldly with its really massive ancient lava flows! At the Visitor Center, we found out that the area was formed by a hot spot which periodically broke through weak spots in the earth's crust as the crust shifted over time due to continental drift. The hot spot is currently located in the southwest corner of Yellowstone National Park and is generally unrelated to the geyser activity in the park.

We stayed the night in the town of Arco which we discovered was the first town electrified with nuclear power (Atoms for Peace) in 1955. A bit further down the road we saw where the Idaho National Laboratory that had done the science to create such a feat and in its history has built over 50 reactors.

Next we drove through the northwest corner of Yellowstone National Park and saw quite a number of elk but no bison this time. We had been there several times previously so did not stop to see the mineral pools & geysers.

We continued driving east and found the Little Big Horn Battlefield. National Monument. Skip went into the Visitor Center to see what it was all about while I stayed in the car with Jackie. Turns out they don't let dogs out of the cars (the whole battlefield is considered a national cemetery) (Sigh!) but when Skip got back to the car he said that we could drive the five mile extent of the Battlefield. It was a beautiful drive with gently rolling hills, creeks, blue skies with fluffy clouds. Too bad we couldn't forget that this had been the site of a horrific battle between Sitting Bull's group of Sioux and Nez Perce Indians who couldn't live in the confines of the white man's reservations and the US Armed Cavalry who were intent on returning them there so many years ago.

Skip remembered seeing a movie with Dustin Hoffman called *Little Big Man*, a fictional account of Custer's Last Stand at the Little Big Horn Creek massacre. The movie was quite a departure from the events portrayed at the actual battlefield. One fact was quite clear, however. 200 cavalry soldiers trying to corral 7000 Indians, both armed with rifles -- a stupid act of futility!

Monday, 9/12, we drove from Sioux Falls, SD to Madison, WI. The drive was long and pretty boring. The weather was clear and soon got very windy. Lots and lots of farms growing corn (for humans, animals or ethanol -- I don't know which). Sometimes gently rolling hills and other times flat as the proverbial pancake. Just prior to reaching the Wisconsin border at the Mississippi River the terrain suddenly changed. We were coming off the high prairie into the Mississippi River escarpment featured by wooded hillsides where the roadway descended down to the river basin and across to La Crosse, WI.

Overnight we had quite a lightning, rain & thunder show! We're in the mid-west, Jackie (she hid in the driver door footwell of the van in response to nature's pyrotechnics)!!


