#### Before the dance:

 Notify the Super Square Head, Stephanie Stevens, (408-499-9182) of any needed changes to assigned dates.

- The designated Square Heads should arrive by 6:15 PM and stay until clean up is finished around 9:45 PM. A Katydids member with key access will open the gates and will secure the hall at end of evening.
- Check the restrooms for supplies & tidiness.
  Because of COVID we will not be providing drinks. Single serving commercially made & wrapped snacks are welcomed.
- In the hall, set up one table for signing in and another for snacks. One unopened table needs to go in front of the piano. Flyers can go onto the top of the freezer.
- Place hand sanitizer on sign-in and snack table and at front of hall and at each round table.
- Set up the easel & board to receive the birthday/ anniversary dates provided by the Treasurer.

#### **During Club dance:**

- Welcome everyone as they enter.
- Collect a \$8.00 donation from each guest and have them sign in. "Regular" guests check the prepared guest sheet, new guests sign the guest book.
- In the green box, there is an envelope with \$70 petty cash for making change.
- Check the member sign-in list to see if we have any members on LOA. Those on LOA who will be dancing pay our Guest Donation of \$8.00.

- If Treasurer is not present, pass monies collected to any Executive Board Member.

### $^\prime$ Road Gypsies 2022

The past several years when Skip and I have taken a road trip across the country, we sent a newsletter to our family and friends telling of our adventeures along the way. The following are portions from *Road Gypsies 2022 #1 and #2* 

.The impetus for the road trip is a Reunion of International Voluntary Services (IVS) volunteers being held in Birmingham AL, 3-6 October. We could have chosen to fly but after having done that in late May and then contracting COVID, Steph really wasn't eager to fly this time.

On Wednesday, 7 September we *finally* took off only to turn around a few blocks down the road having forgotten an important item. We finally left San Jose around 10:30am. It turns out the Mosquito Fire had tuned up the prior afternoon and we were under a thick smoke plume from Auburn all the way to Reno and beyond. Interestingly it was 108 degrees at home and only got up to 87 degrees in Fernley NV, Amazing!

The next morning we drove to Salt Lake City and again were surprised that it wasn't scorching-hot. We stayed the night at the Salt Lake City Plaza Hotel and Steph was crushed with the idea of being "feet" from the front door of genealogy research heaven and not able to do any research. We left early the next morning and as we headed east on I-80 noted that we did not see ANY trains on their east-west trek. We got off of I-80 at Laramie, WY, and drove south (Surprise, in a heavy drizzle!!) to the Fort Collins area to spend the night at a KOA Campgroundin one of their cabins. We have our sleeping bags with us so it worked out fine.

Friday we headed back north to Cheyenne (still drizzling and only 46 degrees) and got back on I-80 east. At some point along this leg of the trip, don't recall just where, it started to really rain. Wow! That was fun; first rain we've seen in months and our car got a free bath!! Spent the night in Grand Island, Nebraska.

From Grand Island, we drove on east and then turned north towards Omaha and on into Iowa.,Ida Grove County to be more precise. My great grandfather moved there in the 1880s before moving the family to central Oregon where he died at age 44 and left two sons aged 11 and 7 with the elder boy being my grandfather. I was hoping to find the earlier land records where they lived in Galva, a small rural farming community. The Librarian at the Ida Grove Community Library was very helpful and found that J.N. Dennis owned 160 acres of land at T89N R39, West of 5th Principal Meridian, Section 34 NE Corner. Now I have to find an 1885 Plat book to figure out exactly where the property was located.

Noted for Iowa: saw more acres of corn in Iowa and, surprise, lots of flies!

Over the next couple of days we continued east on I-80 and then went north into Wisconsin. I wanted to check out the Mukwanago area where my Bovee family arrived from New York in the mid-1830s. The family soon moved on to Eagle in Waukesha County. Unfortunately there wasn't much information to find.



Saturday, 9/17 after leaving Illinois, we traveled southeast into Indiana and south to Winchester, Kentucky, to see the summer home that Skip's daughter, Tiff, and her husband recently acquired. It is in a lovely area and we can easily visualize their horses on their rural property.

This is a much different trip than those we have done in past years. Instead of camping in our van, we are, for the most part, hoteling it and traveling on the Interstate highway system. In some ways it is a much more boring trip but having AC, both in the car and in the rooms, heat and electricity is a huge plus at our almost 80 years of age.

We left Winchester, KY and reached Sevierville, TN to visit with a square dance friend of ours who had moved there many years ago. We arranged to meet her for lunch the next day. Unfortunately she was feeling unwell that day and we had to change our plans. We had also wanted to visit with a cousin whois now living west of Sevierville but she was unable to meet with us either. We decided to move on.



We headed southwest and ended up at another KOA Campground in Sweetwater, TN. We stayed in one of their "rustic" cabins. We were surprised when we entered the cabin, which was the "Dolly" Cabin, and found that it had a small refrigerator, a cable TV, heater and AC!! This is "rustic?" It is a lovely campground and we liked it so much that we stayed an extra day to "catch up with ourselves."

We left the KOA and headed to Atlanta where we wanted to see if we could find more information about Skip's gr-gr grandfather, James Denning, who was killed during the Civil War in June 1864 on (alleged) Pine Mountain near Atlanta, GA. When we arrived in town that afternoon we happened upon the Kennesaw Mountain Battlefield Visitor's Center where we talked at some length with Jake who is an historian there. He showed us some maps of the battles in the area around the time of Skip's ancestor's death. Very interesting. Eight years ago, we discovered Pine Mountain and when we parked the car at the peak to get out an read the historical sign, we found that it was marking the place where General Leonidas Polk was killed by a Union shell. A bit into the woods on private property is a stone monument to remember General Polk and how he was killed by a cannonball that essentially cut him in half. While we were reading the marker beside the roadway, a gentleman came out of the house across from the sign and path and walked towards us. He was Melvin Dishong and he asked what we were looking for and told us he knew a fair bit about Civil Wr events in the area. We struck up a conversation and discovered that he is a ham radio operator like Skip and invited us to see the "antenna farm" he ha erected in his backyard. Unfortunately, this time through, Melvin was not home when we drove by but we did call and later that day he returned our phone call.

In this further conversation, we found that Mel knew little about he Battle at Gilgal Church, which we now believe is where James Denning actually died under the command of Union General Hooker. We also found out that Mel is a member of a much larger Civil War history group which meets monthly and to which he extended an invitation for us to attend. (we will try to make this part of our early October schedule.)

The next morning we too awhile to decide just what we wanted to do next and finally decided that we would try to seee a couple of Skip's cousins who live in the Myrtle Beach, SC area. We did not leave the Atlanta area until almost noon and figured it would be an 8-hour drive so we thought we would drive to Columbia or Florence, SC, stay the night and then finish the drive the next morning. Well, plans have a way of changing. We finally got off the highway at Florence and checked out the hotel there. Way too expensive so we decided to drive on and check out the next hotel we came across. By now it is just beginning to sprinkle and it was almost dark. Would you believe that we found no hotels until arriving in North Myrtle Beach?!

That drive from Florence to North Myrtle Beach was very difficult and at times more than a bit scary. Skip handled it all beautifully navigating through heavy rain and a moonless night! We got to our hotel at 9:00pm a bit worse for ear but safely!

The next day we visited with Skip's 5<sup>th</sup> cousin once removed. They had met for the first time when they were at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) in Troy, NY. They had no idea they were actually related until some genealogy work confirmed the connection, We reminisced for quite awhile and then decided that "Lunner" was in order so we ordered the Tour of Italy selection take-out from Olive Garden, added a bottle of nice wine and had a lovely afternoon together.
